ASU and SCAD Admissions Officers Visited NBIS

Last week NBIS welcomed admissions officers from two American universities:

The Arizona State University and the Savannah College of Arts and Design

Information sessions were organised for NBIS students in year 10, 11, 12 and 13 on Monday November 9th and Friday November 13th. Both admissions officers introduced their Universities to our students; their campus locations, the majors offered, the application processes and the scholarship opportunities



Recognised by U.S. News & World Report as the country's most innovative school, Arizona State University is where students and faculty work with NASA to develop, advance and lead innovations in space exploration.

ASU's nationally ranked programs inspire the top-qualified graduates and have positioned the university as a "top-tier" recruiting and hiring institution by more than 50 of the country's top corporations, according to professional recruiters and rankings services around

the world.

During the presentation, our students learned that to be admitted to ASU, they would need to fulfill the following requirements:

1. Course competency:

- ✓ 4 years math
- ✓ 4 years English (non-ESL/ELL courses)
- ✓ 3 years lab sciences (1 year each from biology, chemistry, earth science, integrated sciences or physics)
- ✓ 2 years social sciences
- ✓ 2 years second language
- ✓ 1 year fine arts.







2. Aptitude requirements:

✓ ACT 22 (24 nonresidents) or SAT 1120 (1180 nonresidents)

Students will also need to complete an application form and submit their secondary official transcripts to ASU admissions office

NBIS University guidance counselling is really about inspiring our students, connecting them to admission officers and making sure they have all the support they need as they transition to their next academic level.


