The NBIS Drama Night

Drama is an important tool for preparing students to live and work in a world that is increasingly team-oriented; drama also helps students develop tolerance and empathy. Every year, we celebrate the talent of our students through the NBIS Drama Night. Parents, teachers, siblings and other students gathered to view the NBIS Drama Nights that were held on both the 13th and 14th of May. Years 8 and 9 impressed the audience on Thursday, and the following day it was Year 7s turn to perform.

The NBIS Drama Night is led and organized by Ms. Nausicaa Giavarra, who has been an invaluable member of the NBIS team for many years. During this time, she has become known for her well-planned and entertaining Drama Nights. It is something that both parents and students can look forward to every year. This year was no exception as parents were welcomed on to the NBIS campus for an event for the first time since Covid-19.

The students practiced for weeks to prepare for their performances. It was a culmination of the skills they have learnt during their drama lessons. The students learnt how to analyse and deal



with emotions and values while developing their ability to transmit a message to the audience. In class, they were involved in activities and games that helped them improve their communication, problem-solving and teamwork.

The Year 8-9 Drama night opened with 'The Student's View', a teenager`s radio broadcast about gossiping and how to get a spot in heaven, performed by Adu, David, Eric, Jack, Jason, Julia, Regan, and Tithi.



In Drama, students improve their presentation skills and explore different topics. A perfect example was the next play where the audience were amused by Anna, Harry, Joe, Kit, Natalie, and Noah, from year 8, who performed a skit about the topic of gender stereotypes.



Bullying, love, rules, telephone scams and dangerous experiments were some of the other themes explored during the show.



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Many students had the opportunity to show their individuality with their dramatic monologues; monologues were performed by Annie, Rawasi, Max, Adu, Arturo and Tithi.





The show drew to a conclusion with a hilarious skit adapted by Zhui Rhee entitled 'Doctor Duplicate'.



The Year 7 Drama night presented a range of performances which explored teenagers' lives. The audience gained a glimpse into what year 7 have been learning in Drama class. It was a thrill for the students to perform in front of an audience for the first time in a secondary drama night. The show opened with 'A History of a Messy Room,', a universal topic, followed by 'How to be Popular in 10 Days', which dealt with the social pressure from the image some girls may have.

Class 5A celebrated winning the 'Class Award' for the second time in 4 weeks! Great work 5A!





On the afternoon of May 13, the Chinese department held a meeting themed "Feedback of Book Scrutiny and sharing with homework design".




