






#### Year 3B

**Activity/Unit: Myths/Legends** 

This week the Year 8 students worked on a part from the curriculum that involves the discussion, analysis and research of various myths and legends from the folklore of countries from different parts of the world. They were allowed to use their devices (phones, ipads, laptops, etc.) for the successful completion of this research. The emphasis was on those tales and beliefs that feature mythical creatures (monsters, fairies, apparitions, dragons, giants, etc.). They looked at the more familiar ones (the Loch Ness Monster, Bigfoot, Yeti the Snowman) first, before proceeding with their own research. They delved deeper into the mythology and culture of various nations, and prepared reports and presentations about some of those myths and legends. Through their classmates' works, which also featured colourful illustrations and maps, students were able to get acquainted with interesting, also mysterious, creatures and to learn about the beliefs and the environment that have brought them to life. It was both an entertaining and educational period for the students who wondered and even laughed at the sight of some of the creatures presented, but also listened carefully to what their classmates had to say about them.

#### **Chemistry Revision and Practical Club**









This practical session for Y12 students is about titration. Students use burettes to accurately find out the concentration of tested chemicals. The titration technique is an important skill set required in the Chemistry curriculum. In my class, students are encouraged to practice many experimental skills. During this time, they will encounter many unexpected situations. Then, students need to find out what went wrong. This will increase their confidence in practical exams and help them to be more proficient.





#### **Clarinet Club**



The clarinet is one of the most famous woodwind instruments. With a warm and sweet sound, it combines with any other instrument naturally and its versatility makes it match almost every music style that exists.

In our classroom, we learn a lot more things than just playing the clarinet: music reading, music theory, singing, and developing our inner musical sense are the basics to becoming a good musician and a music lover.








#### **Introduction of the General Affairs Office**
