

After one day's classes, now it's time to go home, some of our students and teachers leave school in order. Some of our students and teachers have a great time in the ECAs Clubs.












NBIS Students Experience the Cultural Heritage Event



Reception C

In Reception C, we have been working on the ability to subitise, which means identifying the number of things in a set simply by quickly looking at them—not by counting them one by one. Subitising is an essential part of developing number sense in early years children by helping them relate numbers to actual items or groups of objects. This understanding of part-part-whole relationships allows children to separate and combine numbers and accelerates understanding of addition and subtraction. In our lesson, we worked on addition by using the subitising ability worked previously. We used the dice faces from one to six to add and find the correct amount for ten. The children discovered that different combinations could make the same number, such as 6 and 4; 5, 2 and 3; 5, 4 and 1; 4, 3, 2, and 1.



























Year 3B: A New Year, A New Look

Following the Spring Festival, Class 3B received three new friends: Aimee, Austin and Brayden. They are from USA, New Zealand and Australia respectively. Magnetic Rail

In Science class, we learned about magnets and how the two poles interact. We made a paper magnet and colored the north pole red, the south pole blue. We learned that the same poles repel, and the opposites attract. We acted out these magnetic interactions with a partner. Then, we challenged ourselves to make a long magnetic rail. Now we know how the toy trains are put together. Last but not least, we watched a video on a series of magnet experiments. Looks like our weekends will be busy with some cool science experiments!














Year 4B

This raises motivation through ownership and therefore makes teaching more effective.





Y9 Chemistry Holiday Workshop


The year 9 students came to school during the first two days of the holiday to complete some longer chemistry practicals. The students completed practicals that demonstrated the reactivity of metals, exothermic and endothermic reactions, titrations, and displacement reactions which they had been learning about towards the end of semester 1. In groups of 2 - 3 they completed practical papers taken from IGCSE Chemistry past papers to familiarise themselves with what could be expected next year if they decide to take on chemistry and the type of questions that could be asked. Students recorded results, displayed their data in appropriate graphs and planned and tested out their own experiments. They also become comfortable with using equipment such as a burette and a bunsen burner, correctly. The AS Chemistry students helped on both of the days which the year 9 students (and Ms Smout) appreciated. The year 9 students were able to ask the AS students many questions about what to expect in later years and how best to approach each experiment. Many students expressed how they are now very excited to take on chemistry in IGCSE!

Engineering Club Updates - Skateboard Parks

Between November and January, the Engineering club learnt how to build their own skateboard parks out of cardboard. The project was designed, presented and taught by Maverick Gervais (9A) who was assisted by Ms Smout. Maverick led a tutorial session where he presented his own PowerPoint presentation to the group. He taught them how to construct different ramps, corners, and how best to use a glue gun and board cutters.





- Measure Twice Cut Once
- Use multiple strokes cutting cardboard
- Make precise measurements & cuts
- Include cardboard thickness in your measurements (~5mm)
