Students had the chance to attend an inspiring lecture by Dr Ahmad Mousa on Engineering Judgement and Decision-Making. From surveying sites and collecting soil samples to analysing geological data and designing structures like dams that safeguard communities, his examples brought the subject to life.

"Dr Ahmad mentioned that there is a lot of decision-making involved in engineering. Engineers must weigh facts, anticipate challenges, and adapt to unexpected changes — just like we do in our personal and academic lives. This idea resonated with me because civil engineering isn't just about math and physics; it's about creativity and responsibility. For the past year and a half, I've looked up to this field as something I'd like to pursue. After hearing him speak so passionately about the work I'm interested in, I'm more convinced than ever that this is the path for me. It requires both creativity and logic, and I genuinely think this is what I want to do."



This week, Nursery A children embarked on the topic of transportation, full of fun learning and activities. Over the week, our tiny drivers got up close with various land, water and air vehicles through games, crafts and role-playing activities - growing while laughing and playing!

<u>Car Tuff Tray</u>: This activity is able to improve children's hand-eye coordination and boost concentration, requiring children to focus, thereby improving their attention span. Meanwhile, it also develops the traffic safety awareness. They learned road safety, traffic signals, and responsible behaviour as pedestrians or future drivers.











Early Years Section

Name Train: The children showed strong engagement and emerging literacy skills during this activity. While their letter formation and recognition are developing, the playful approach effectively fostered their interests in spelling. This foundation supports future reading and writing readiness.











Number Formation Using Vehicles: The children drove their favourite vehicle along the roads to learn how numbers are formed. They identified and used different vehicles and learned symbolic meanings of colours, too (green: go; red: stop; orange: slow down). Some of the children used their language to explain number paths.















Primary Assembly



During this week's assembly, Year 5C took the lead in promoting online safety. The students gave several demonstrations on how to stay safe online, including the importance of using strong and secure passwords, thinking before posting, and not sharing personal information with people online. We also discussed digital footprints and why it is important to see the internet as both a wonderful and helpful tool—and one that must be used with care, as what we post online can last forever.

HISTORY NEWSLETTER

Dwight Eisenhower's Order of the Day for D-Day (from nationalarchives.gov.uk) As our Year 10 historians continue their exploration of World War II, they are delving into two crucial theatres of the conflict: the dramatic D-Day landings and the liberation of Europe, and the gruelling Pacific Campaign with its Island-Hopping strategy. These pivotal events not only shaped the outcome of the war but also demonstrated the extraordinary courage and strategic ingenuity of those who fought.

On 6 June 1944, the Allies launched Operation Overlord, the largest seaborne invasion in history. Students have been examining the immense planning behind the operation, from the deception tactics of Operation Fortitude, which misled German forces about the invasion's location, to the landings themselves on the heavily defended shores of Omaha, Utah, Gold, Juno, and Sword. Beyond the landings, the class has explored how the success of D-Day opened the way for the liberation of Paris in August 1944 and the Allied advance into Germany.



While Allied forces pushed through Europe, a different kind of war was being fought across the vast Pacific. Students have analysed brutal battles such as Guadalcanal, Iwo Jima, and Okinawa, where soldiers faced not only fierce resistance but also extreme terrain and weather. The use of kamikaze attacks by Japanese pilots highlighted the desperation of the conflict, while the eventual use of atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki brought a controversial end to the war. These events have sparked thoughtful discussions about the ethics of warfare and the long-term consequences of military decisions.

Through their studies, our Year 10 historians are gaining a profound appreciation for the complexities of World War II—the strategies that turned the tide, the human cost of global conflict, and the enduring impact of these events on the modern world. As they continue to engage with primary sources and historical debates, they are developing not only their knowledge but also their critical thinking about the past and its relevance today.

- Conclusion: The CIS is designed to foster a culture of continuous improvement, ensuring that we remain responsive to the needs of our stakeholders and committed to enhancing our processes.

3 UNNC Update (PB)

The international principal informed members that the partner school contract agreement with UNNC is currently under review with revised terms and conditions to be agreed.

4 Safety Letter + Government Reporting (PB)

Overview: It is imperative for our school to collect signed safety letters from parents, confirming their awareness of the safety measures and incident prevention protocols for the upcoming summer.

Current Status: At NBiS, we have only achieved a return rate of 60-70% for these safety letters, in contrast to national schools, which have successfully attained a 100% return rate. This discrepancy underscores the need for enhanced engagement with our families regarding this critical matter.

<u>Call to Action:</u> We would like to emphasize the importance of this initiative and seek the continued support of our families to ensure that all safety letters are signed and returned promptly.

Proposed Actions:

Continue distributing printed copies of the safety letter to all families.

Encourage students to remind their parents to sign and return the letters. Teachers may consider awarding house points to students who successfully bring back the signed forms

Further incentivize participation by offering a small reward to the first classes that achieve a 100% return rate of signed safety letters.

Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated as we work together to ensure the safety and well-being of our students.
